After the public meeting, the Project team will review the feedback and advance the ideas that best represent the public's preferences within the design and safety parameters. DOT&PF is aware that installation of a barrier along the Project corridor will not eradicate pedestrian safety concerns, but the agency believes it's a solid step toward improving safety in the area.
